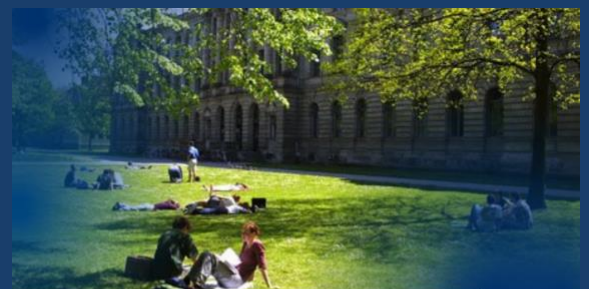

## IDP-Business and Human Rights: POST Workshop II Partnerships in Practice



On March 9 - 10, 2023, some members of the International Doctorate Programme "Business and Human Rights: Governance Challenges in a Complex World" (IDP) traveled to Madrid to attend and co-organize the workshop on "Partnerships in Practice" as part of the "Partnerships Orchestrating Sustainability Transformations" (POST) project. POST is a collaboration initiative between FAU Erlangen-Nürnberg (FAU), Scuola Normale Superiore (SNS), and Universidad Politécnica de Madrid (UPM), funded by EELISA European University. The POST agenda supports the UN SDG 17 on Partnerships for Goals and aims to understand cross-sector partnerships for sustainability transformations through exploring its meaning, dimensions, context, and nature in Europe, Asia, Latin America, and Africa through interdisciplinary research, exchange, and collaboration. POST was an initiative of the representatives from the IDP at FAU: Chau Bui, Loren Bustos, Kania Guzaimi, Shuvra Dey, Supriya Singh, and Xu Kang.



After successfully conducting the first POST workshop on "Partnerships for Sustainable Development: Searching for Theoretical and Methodological Perspectives" last January 2023 hosted by SNS in Florence, the Madrid workshop hosted by UPM was conceptualized to further support and build upon the fundamental understandings of Partnership by adopting a practical and context-sensitive approach. Day 1 kick-started with a meeting with the EELISA Executive Director, Sofia d' Aguiar. In the afternoon, the hybrid session on "Partnerships in context: an approach to transformation" opened an important discussion on Partnership with guest speakers Dr. Leda Stott (European Commission), Prof. Markus Krajewski (FAU), and Prof. Markus Beckmann (FAU). This is then followed by a workshop on "Partnership's lifecycle" facilitated by partnership experts, Leda Stott and Javier Mazorra. The workshop was devoted to unfolding the concept of "Partnership's lifecycle," a well-known framework in the frontier between practice and academia. On Day 2, the session opened with a roundtable on "Partnerships between theory and practice" and invited a panel with diverse and interesting case studies. The aim of this roundtable was to reach out, exchange experiences around a selection of real cases, and enlarge our academic network. Two doctoral researchers from the IDP were also part of that dynamic panel; Bruna Singh presented on the topic titled "Multi Stakeholder Partnerships: A Valuable Tool for Enhancing Leverage in Business and Human Rights," and Nelson Okeyo presented on "ICT Partnerships in Africa, Legitimacy and The Way Forward."



# AUS DEN PROJEKTEN

The POST project brings an in-depth understanding and knowledge-sharing on the different contexts, methods, and best practices surrounding Partnership and sustainability. It also brings opportunities to enrich the network of partnerships among the POST partners and beyond. The next agenda of the POST members from the FAU is to organize the three-day event in Nürnberg on May 24 – 26, 2023. Bringing in the importance of BHR, the event aims to contribute to the scholarly discussions on cross-sector partnerships at the intersection of business and human rights. More information about this will follow soon.

## M.A. Human Rights students visit the former Nazi party rally grounds

The students of the M.A. Human Rights had the opportunity to visit the former Nazi Party Rally Grounds on February 17<sup>th</sup>, guided by programme alumnus Maximilian Deinlein. The tour sought to answer the following questions: Why did so many people go to the Nazi Party Rallies, and what did they do there? What was expected of the Hitler Youth there? What was the purpose of the big buildings, and why are most of them unfinished?



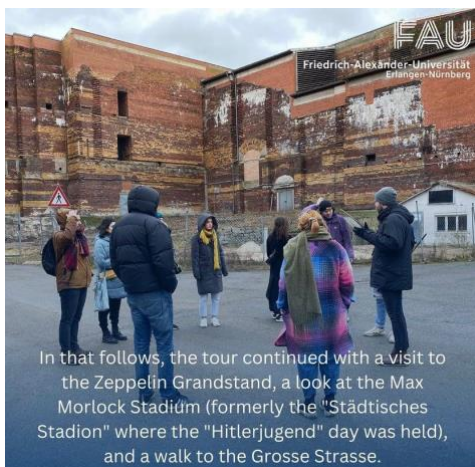
The students of the M.A. Human Rights had the opportunity to visit the former Nazi Party Rally Grounds on February 17<sup>th</sup>.



Firstly, the group met with an alumnus of the MA Human Rights, Maximilian Deinlein, in DoKuPäd's office. The tour started with a backward and forward journey to the time of National Socialism in his office.



Then it continued to the old train station (Bahnhof Dutzendteich), where many of the participants of the Nazi party rallies came from at the time.



In that follows, the tour continued with a visit to the Zeppelin Grandstand, a look at the Max Morlock Stadium (formerly the "Städtisches Stadion" where the "Hitlerjugend" day was held), and a walk to the Grosse Strasse.



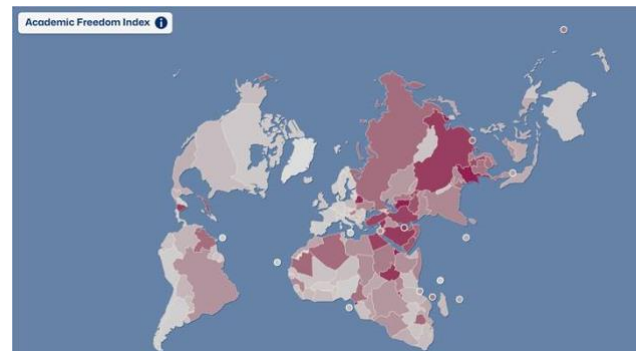
Finally, the ruins of the planned German stadium Silbersee were examined, and the tour ended in the inner courtyard of the former Nazi Party Rally Grounds.

In den „Zehn Thesen zur Wissenschaftsfreiheit“ (Allianz der Wissenschaftsorganisationen, 2019) heißt es unter anderem: „Institutionelle Autonomie und verlässliche Finanzierung sind notwendige Voraussetzungen für freie Wissenschaft.“ Ähnlich postuliert es auch die UNESCO. Aber stimmt es überhaupt? Schützen autonome Universitäten tatsächlich auch die individuelle Wissenschaftsfreiheit? Der Beitrag stützt sich auf den Academic Freedom Index (AFI), um diesen Zusammenhang empirisch zu beleuchten. Mit Hilfe von ökonometrischen Paneldatenmodellen und illustrativen Fallbeispielen stellen die Autor/innen fest: In autonomen Universitäten blüht auch die individuelle Freiheit von Forschung und Lehre.

## Aufarbeitung der Kriegsverbrechen während des Jugoslawienkriegs in Bosnien-Herzegowina – ICLU in Berlin

Auf Einladung der Vizepräsidentin des Bundestags, Frau *Aydan Özüğöz* war ICLU-Chef und Leiter der Internationalen Akademie Nürnberger Prinzipien (INAP) Professor Dr. Christoph Safferling vergangenen Montag, den 13.03.2023 in Berlin auf einer Veranstaltung zur Aufarbeitung von Kriegsverbrechen während des Jugoslawienkriegs in Bosnien-Herzegowina zu Gast. Gemeinsam mit *Ajna Mahmić*, Vertreterin der Organisation TRIAL, die sich für die strafrechtliche Verfolgung von Kriegsverbrechen während des Jugoslawienkriegs einsetzt, der Aktivistin *Joumana Seif* und weiteren Betroffenen und Aktivist:innen, wurden mitunter die Probleme einer Strafverfolgung, wie auch etwaige rechtliche und politische Lösungsansätze diskutiert. Es wurde auch über die Implementierung rechtlicher Mechanismen zum Opferschutz, wie auch möglichen Perspektiven einer Strafverfolgung für die Zukunft gesprochen.
